"We had 84 kids (going into Kindergarten through 6th grade) enrolled in VBS, with an average attendance of 71. The opening/closing sessions were led by Dave Kroeker (MC) and Dorie Thiessen (music leader). The kids loved singing and dancing the Go Fish songs with Kyla Isaac, Sharisse Thiessen and Teegan Werth. The superhero skits were also a big hit, thanks to Rusty Allen (aka. Glory Giver), Norman Schmidt (aka. Glory Getter), Hannah Lacy (aka. Muriel Conners) and Tanner Lacy (aka. Theme Song Guy). All stations went well thanks to the group leaders and station workers. The Funky Beats Station was unique to this VBS curriculum. Josh Wiebe taught the kids different beats on their drums as well as beat boxing with their mouths in the SHINE (glow in the dark) room. So many volunteers helped make this VBS run smoothly!
